Must see in Georgia: Batumi as a part of Post-Convention tour experience

During the Post-Convention tour participants of WFTGA 2019 will visit Batumi—the “Pearl of the Black Sea,” as it is often called, located in the autonomous republic of Adjara. European architects undertook numerous projects in Batumi at the beginning of the 20th century, and today it remains a hub of architectural innovation. One of the oldest cities in Georgia, Batumi was founded in the 8th century, but the initial settlement, Batus, is mentioned in texts that date back to the 4th century BCE.

Gonio-Apsaros Fortress is located 12 km south of Batumi, on the left bank of the River Chorokhi. One of Georgia’s most ancient settlements was located around this fortress. Due to its strategic location, Gonio-Apsaros became a supporting citadel first for the Romans and later to the Byzantines and Ottomans along the eastern Black Sea coastline. The history of Gonio-Apsaros fortress references the myth of Jason and the Argonauts. According to the legend, King Aetes buried his son Apsaros, who was killed by Jason as he fled, in the territory of Gonio. According to some sources, Mathias, one of the 12 disciples of Jesus Christ, is believed to be buried here. There is a museum inside the fortress.

One of the most beautiful regions in Georgia, Adjara is situated in southwest Georgia on the Black Sea coastline. Turkey borders Adjara to the south.

Adjara’s visitors especially admire the region’s pristine and unaltered nature, and it is particularly intriguing for eco tourists.

A: No, only one accompanying person per individual member is allowed. If you wish to be accompanied by more non-members please organize their hotel reservations yourself.

- A: If you have registered during the early-bird period, but haven't paid by the 22 of June (or within the agreed period in your confirmation letter) – your early bird registration will be cancelled, and you will have to register on the regular rates.
